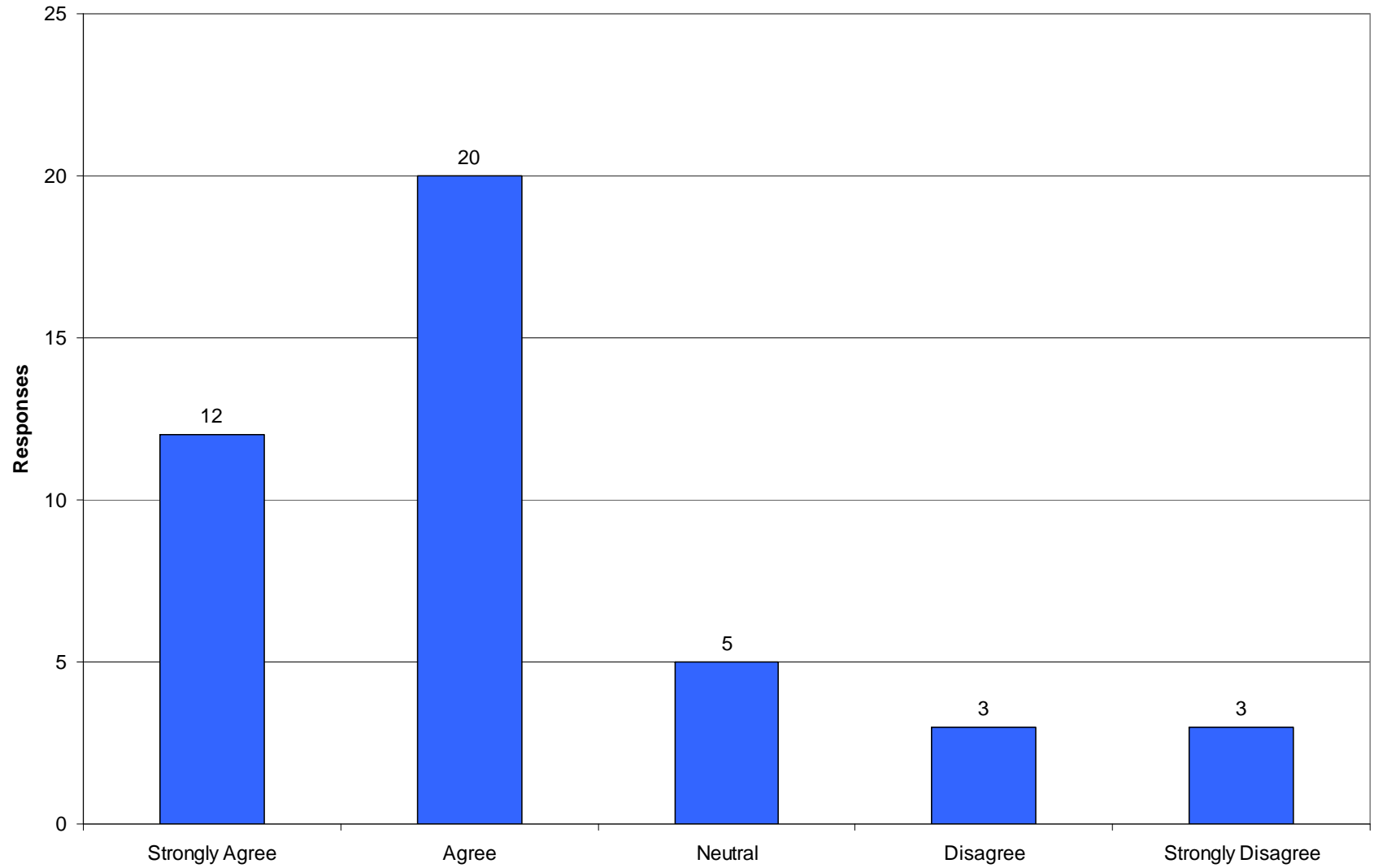




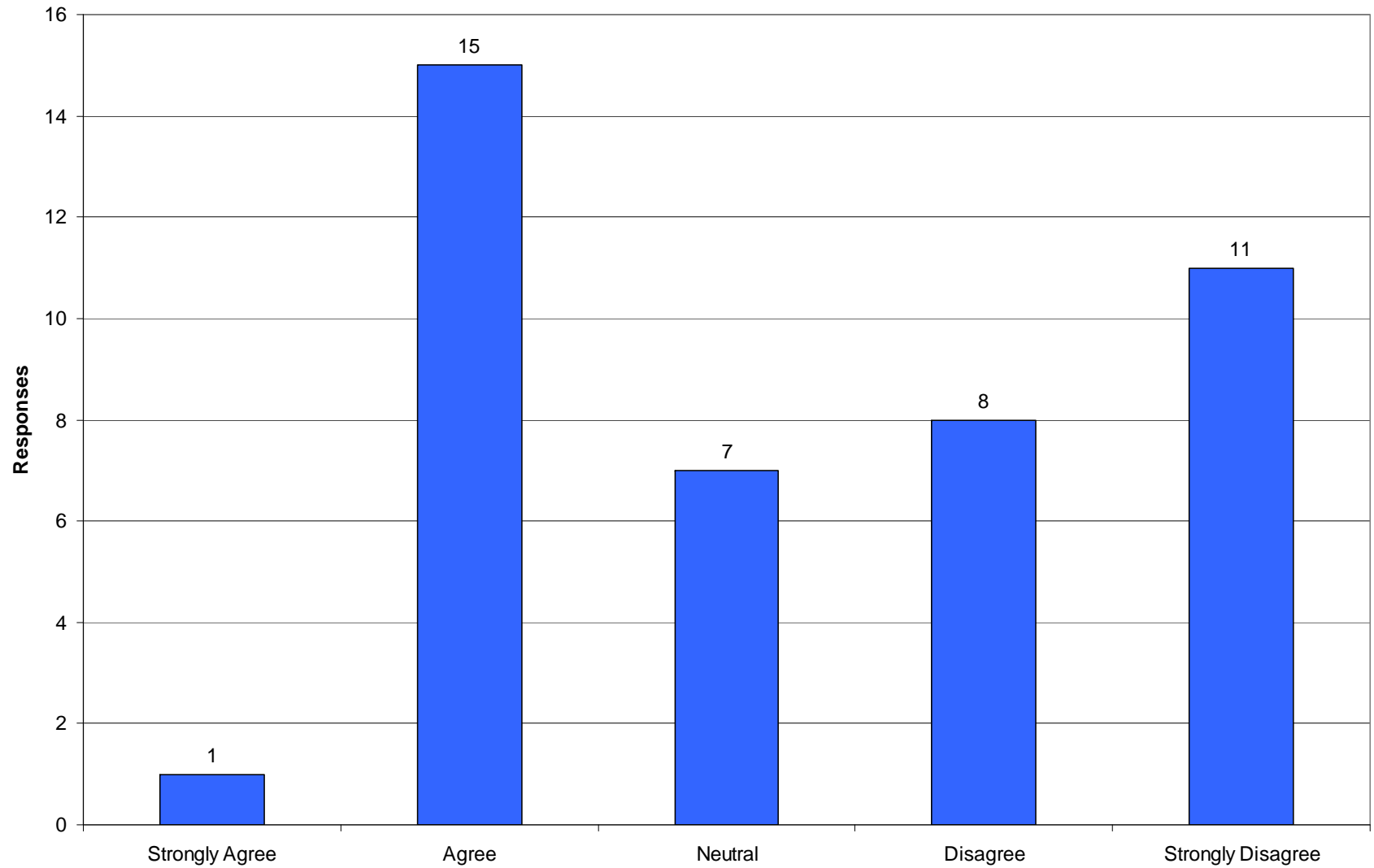

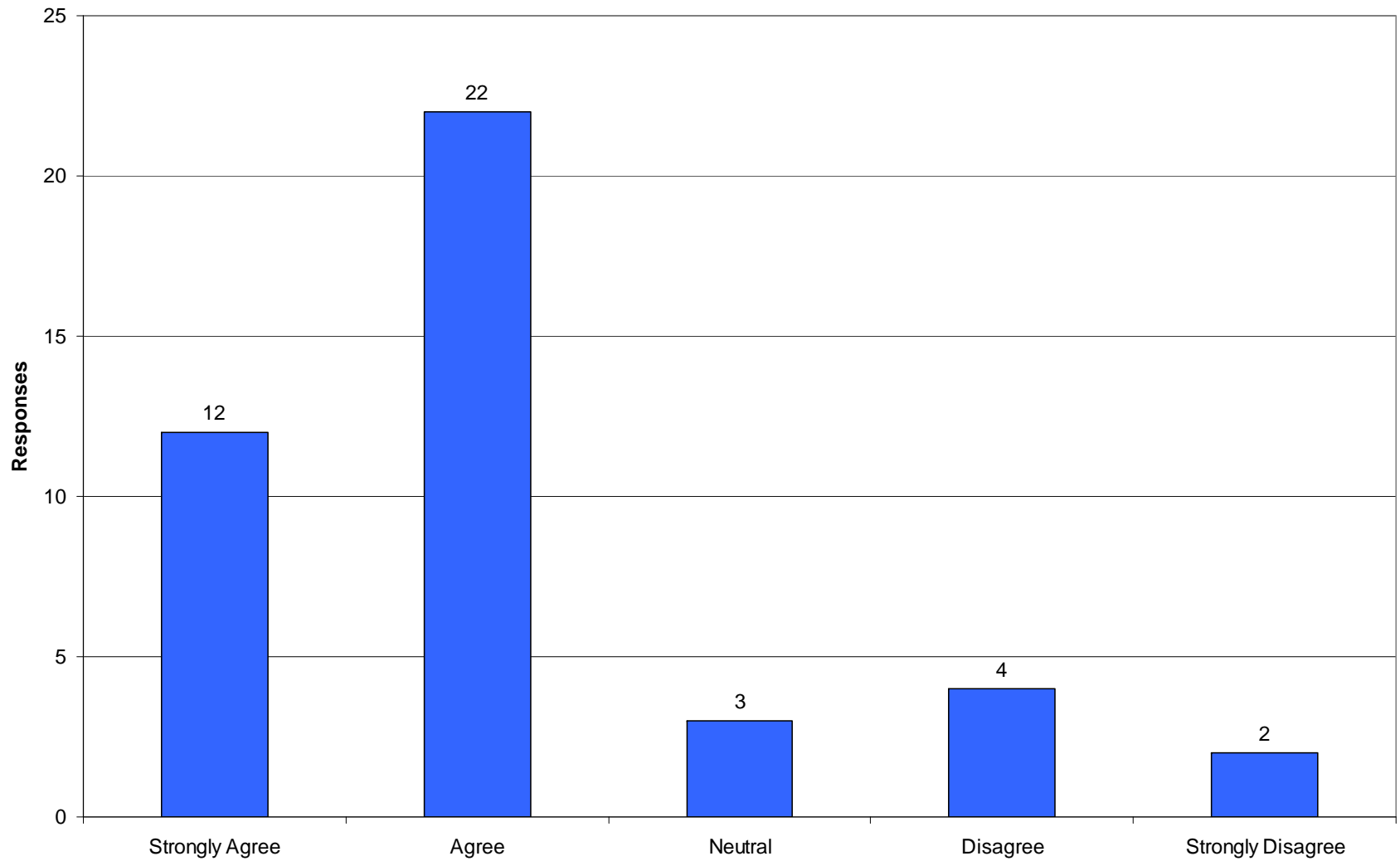
1: Milton should encourage infill development and redevelopment opportunities rather than the development of new land.



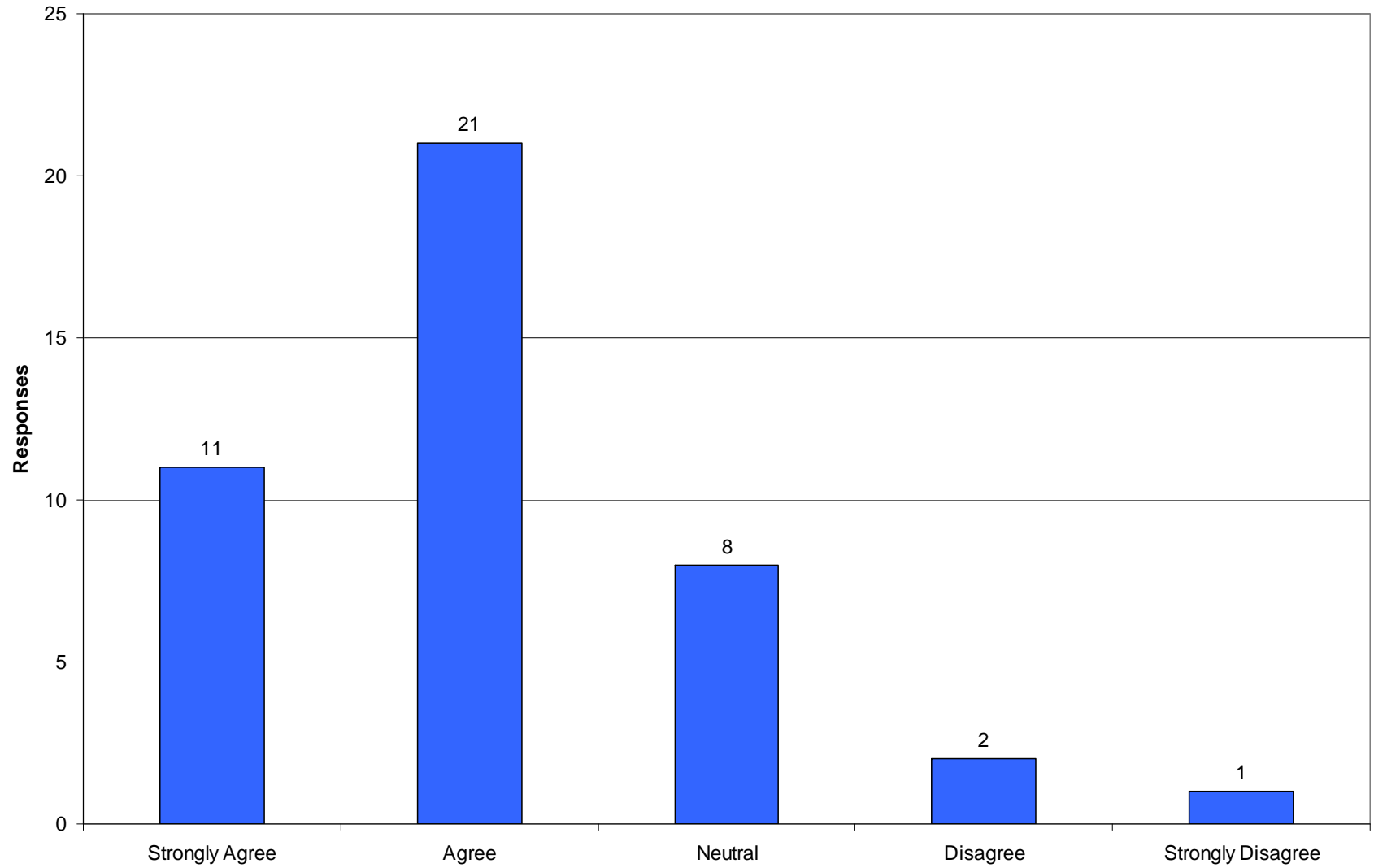
2. Milton should actively recruit new commercial, office, and industrial development.



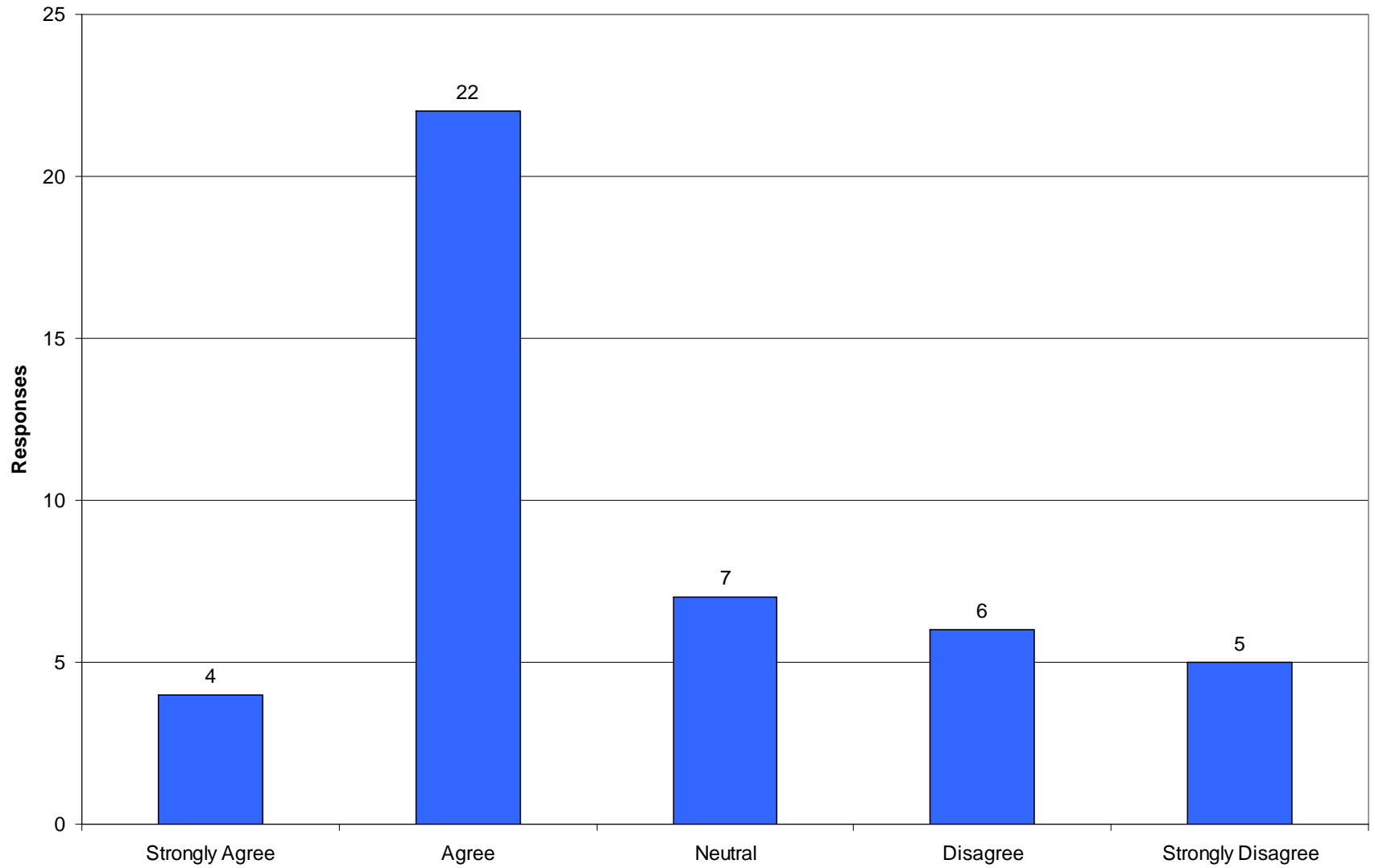

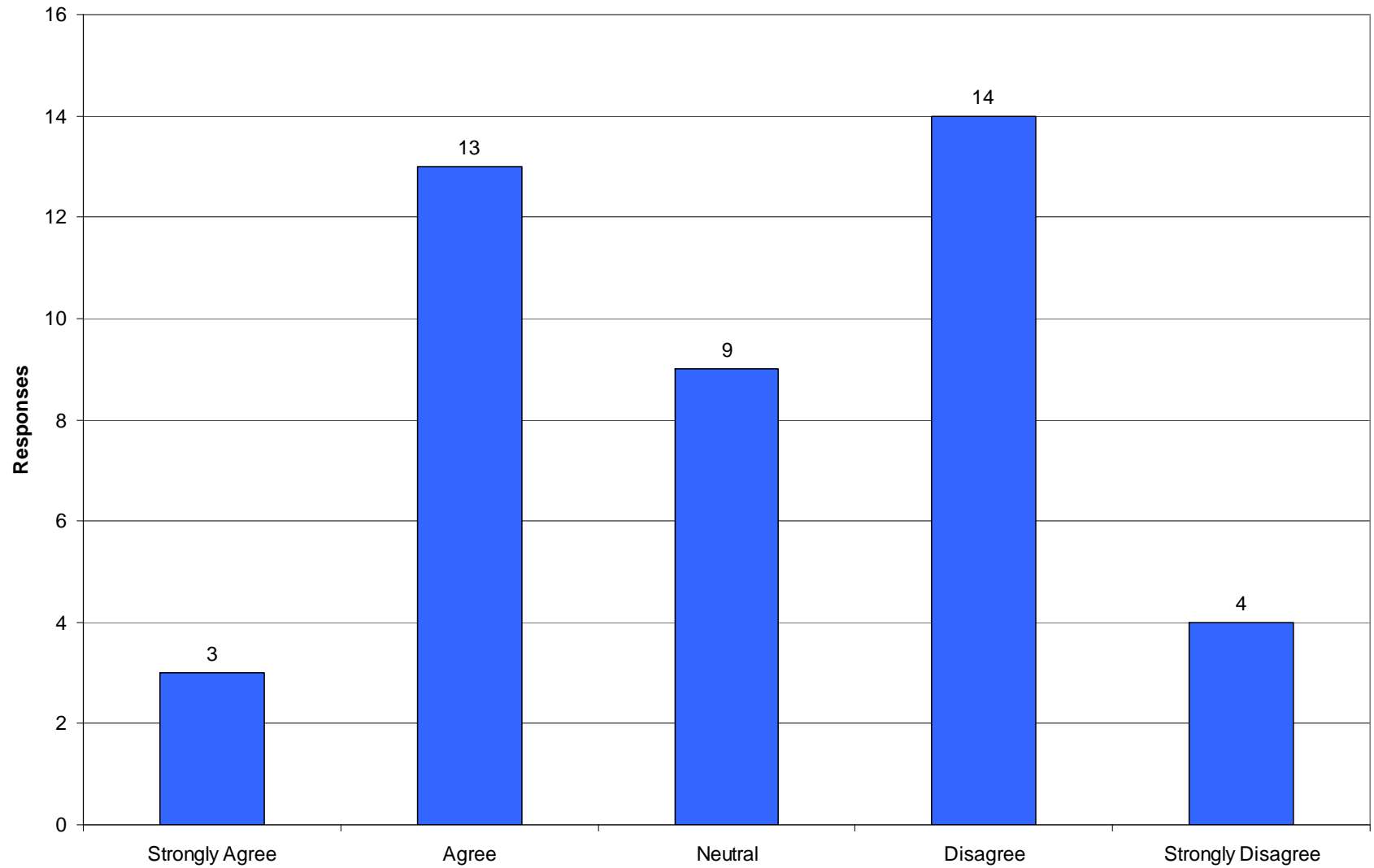
4. Strict code enforcement is needed to ensure that residential areas are well-maintained.



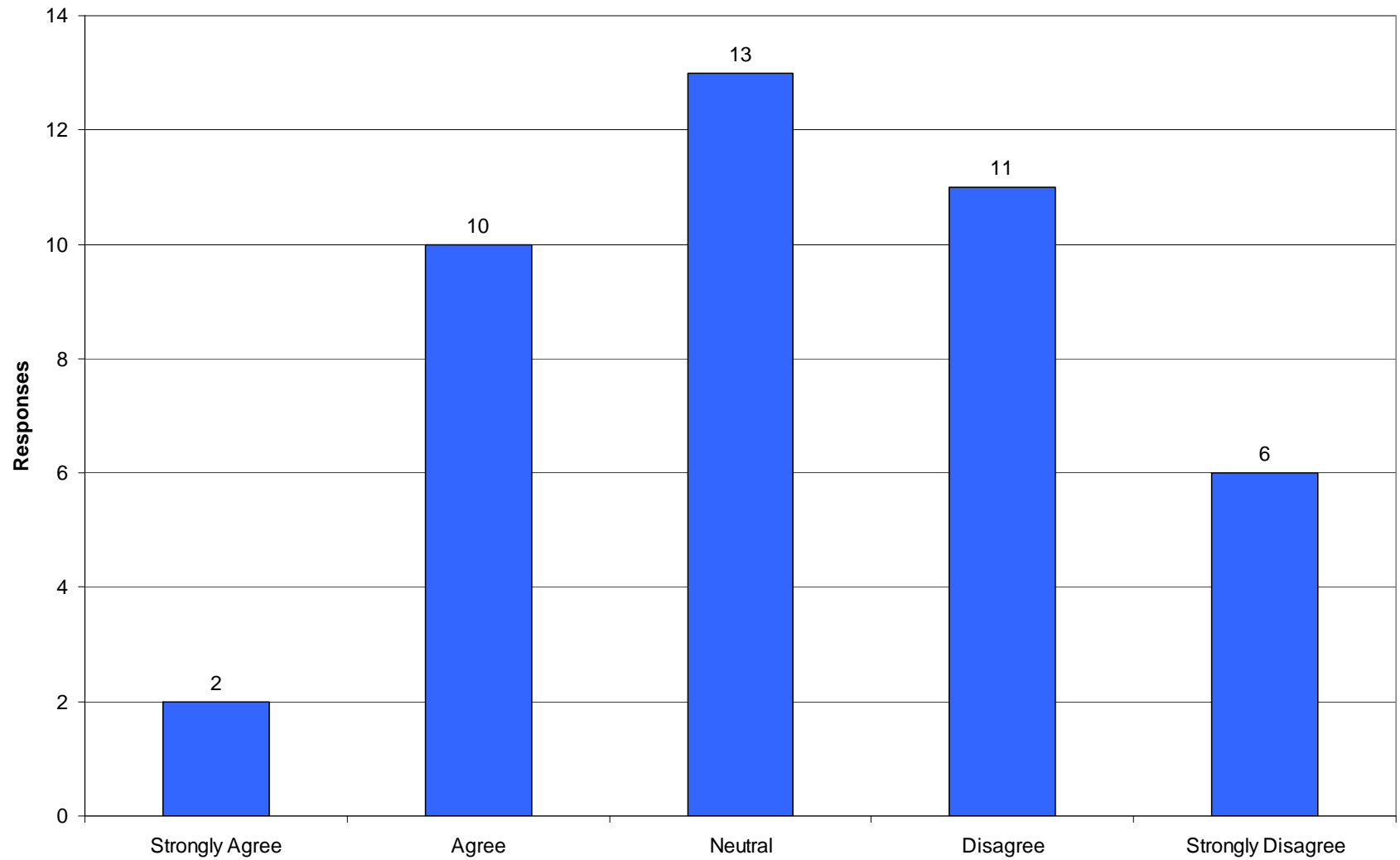
5. Milton should maintain an active business and industry recruitment and retention program.



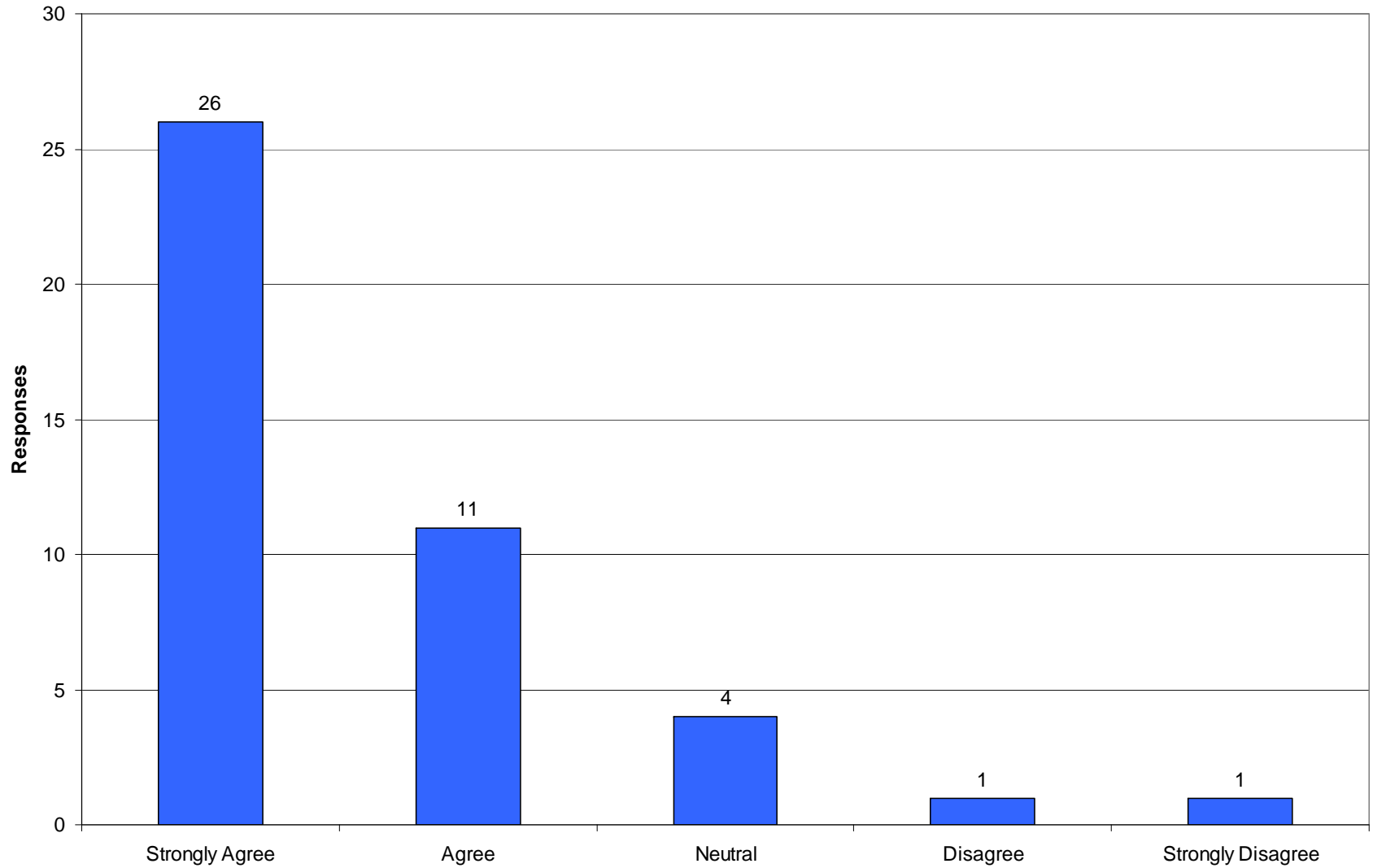
5. Milton should offer business assistance such as tax incentives to foster economic growth.



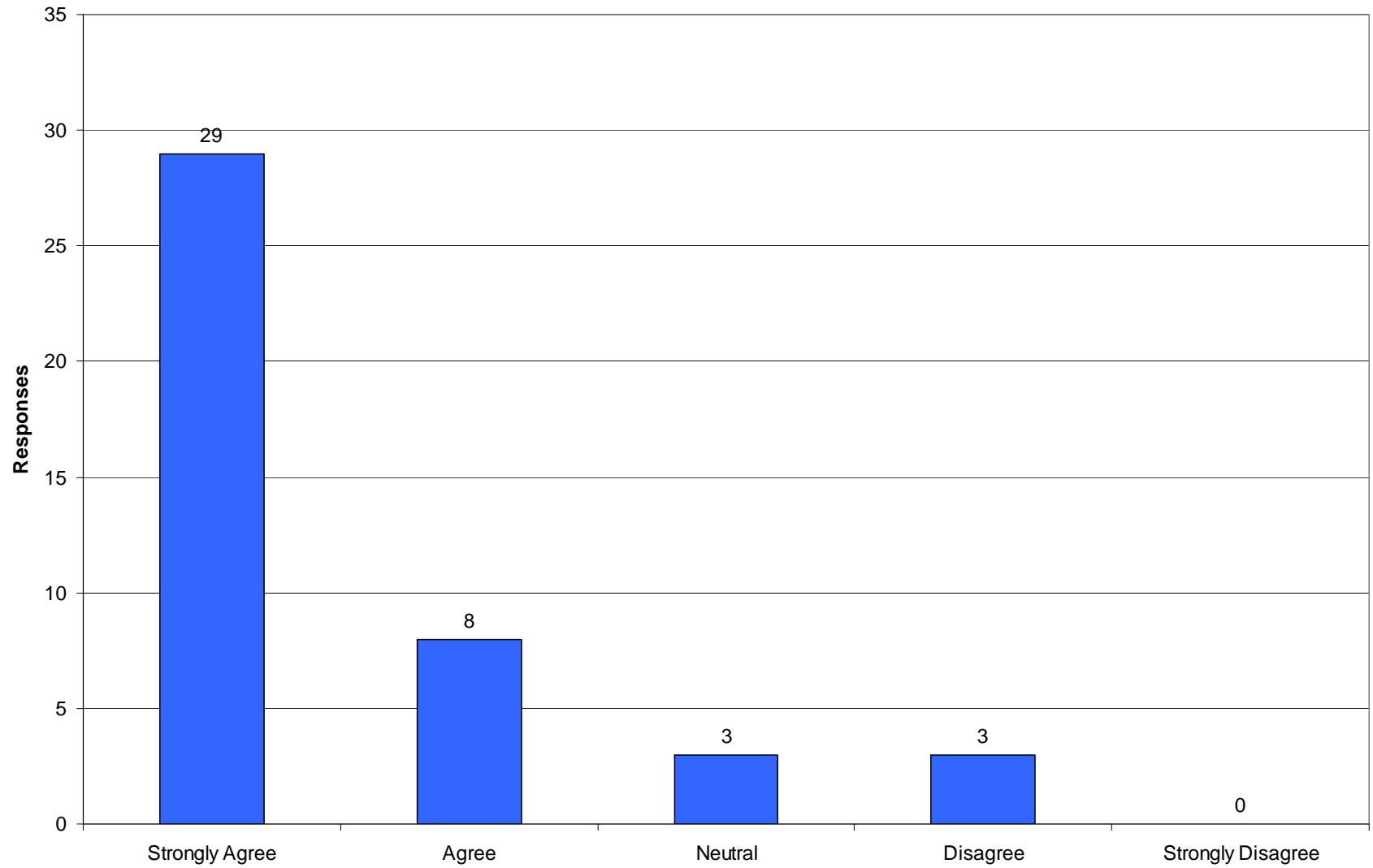
7. Milton should implement workforce training programs in order to ensure that residents have the right skills to match future growth industries and the needs of existing businesses.



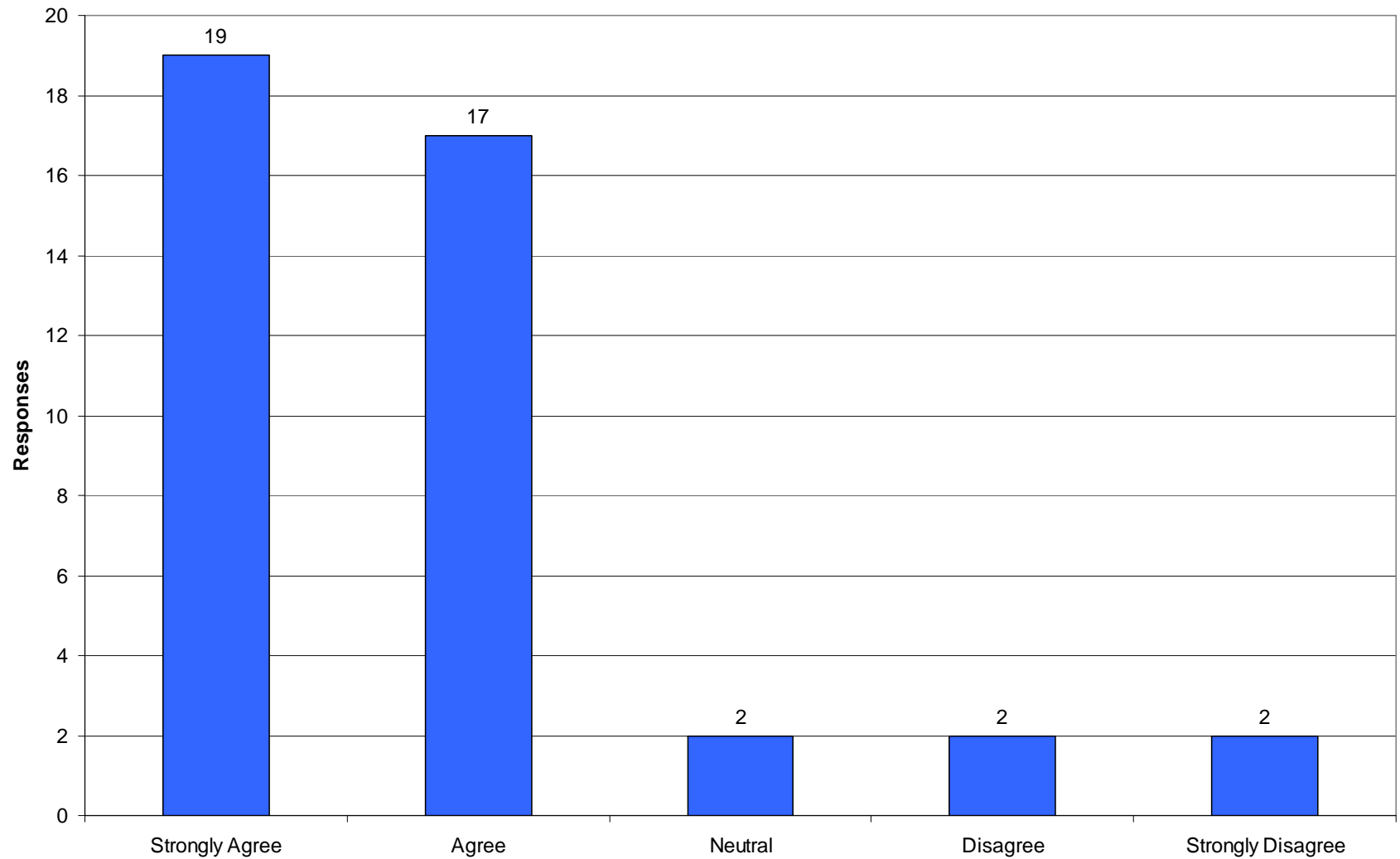
8. Milton should ensure that new development does not exceed the capacity of public services such as schools.



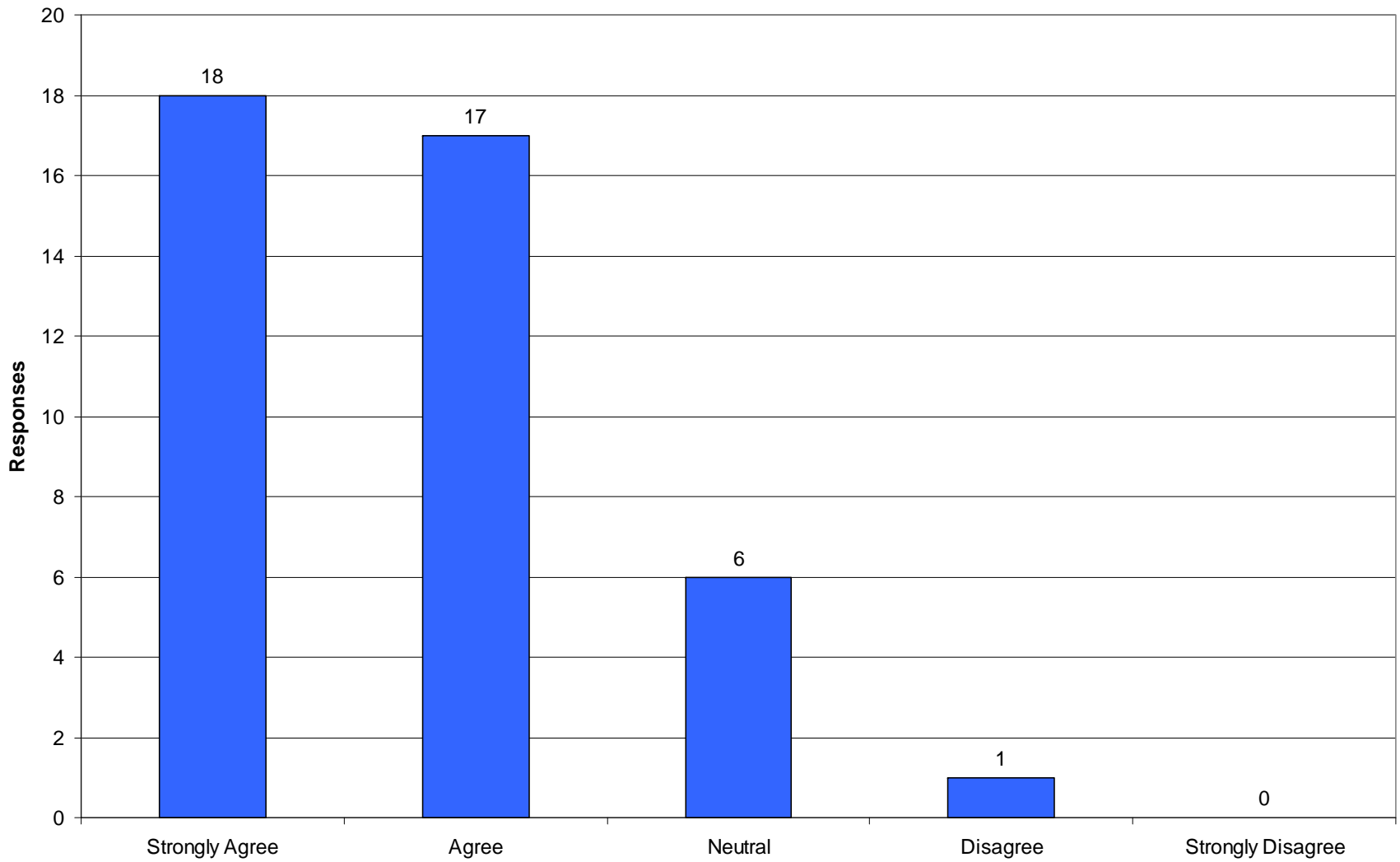
9. Historic buildings in Milton are important and should be preserved.



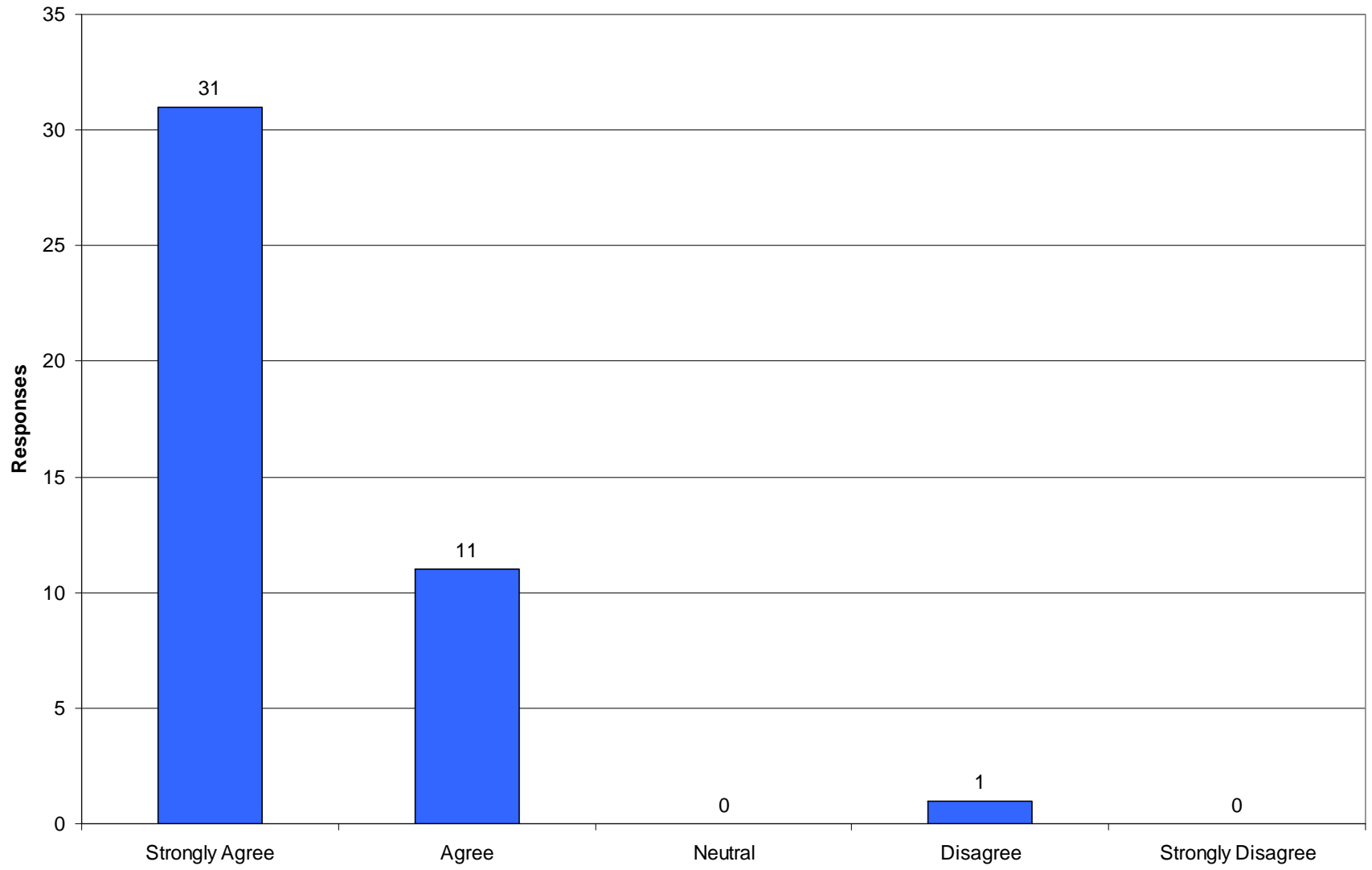
10. Milton should promote arts, cultural, and entertainment activities in order to attract visitors and create a live/work/play community.



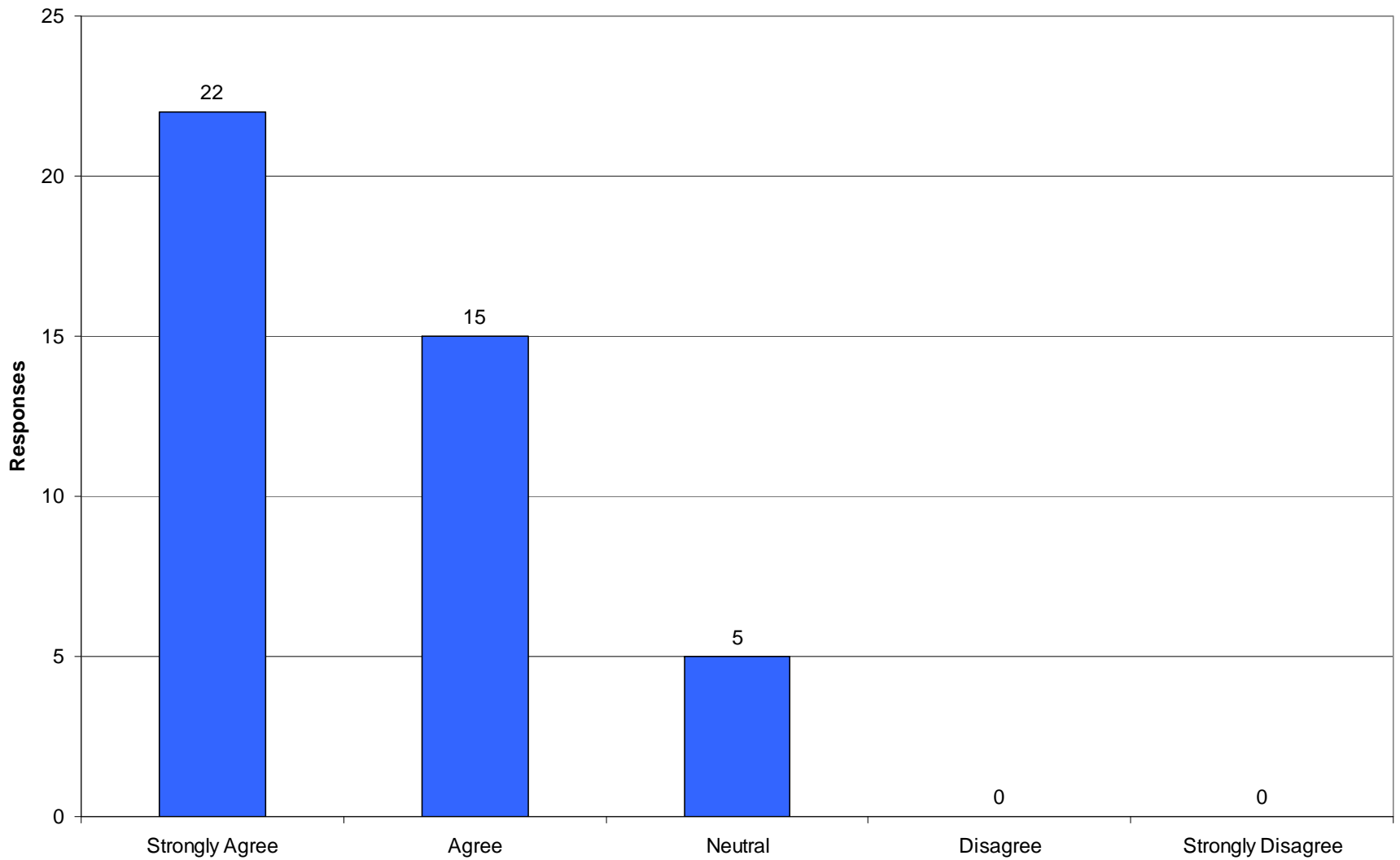
11. Commercial development should be concentrated in walkable centers (such as Crabapple) rather than in automobile-oriented strip shopping centers.



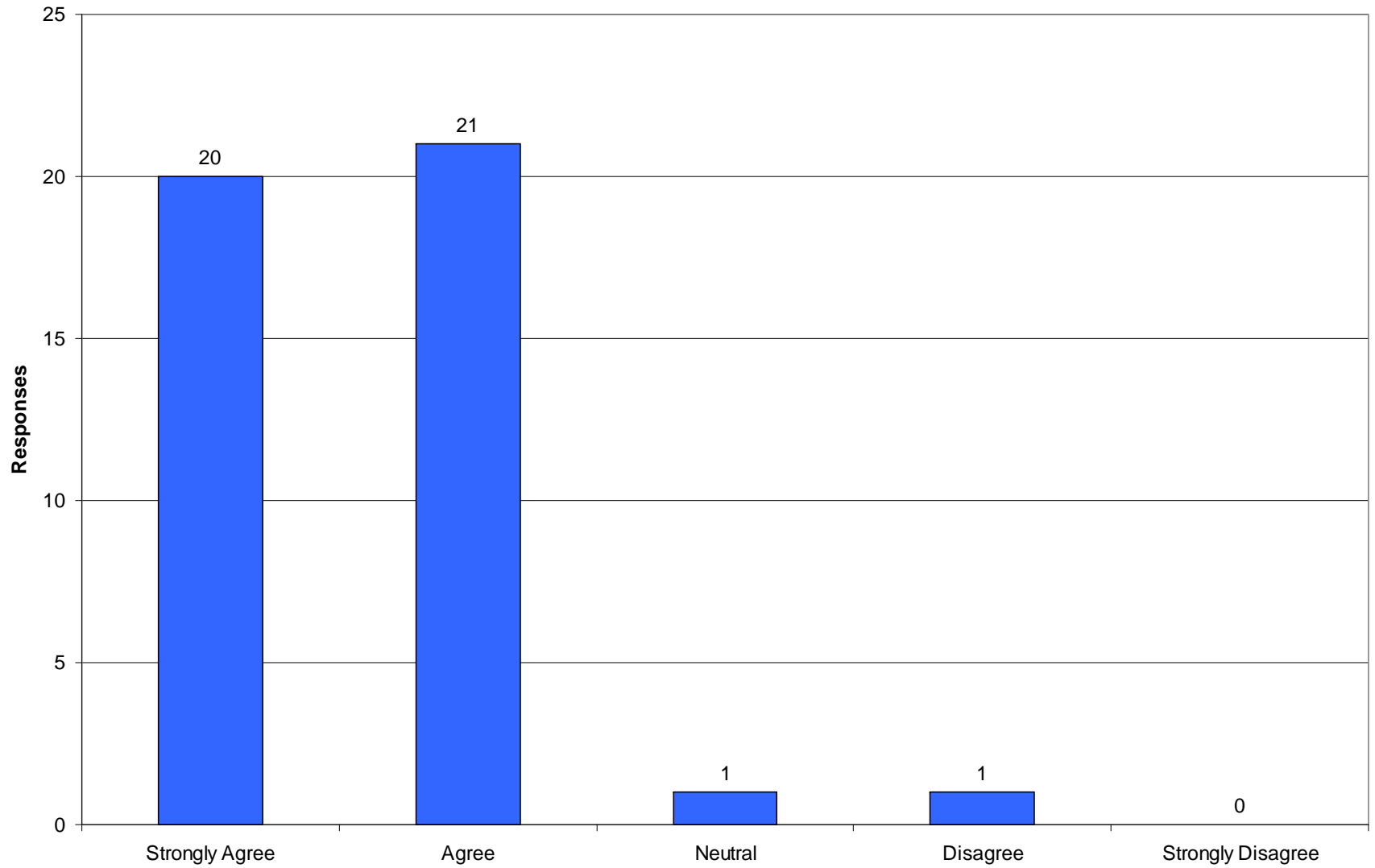
12. The "rural character" of the City of Milton is its most vital asset.



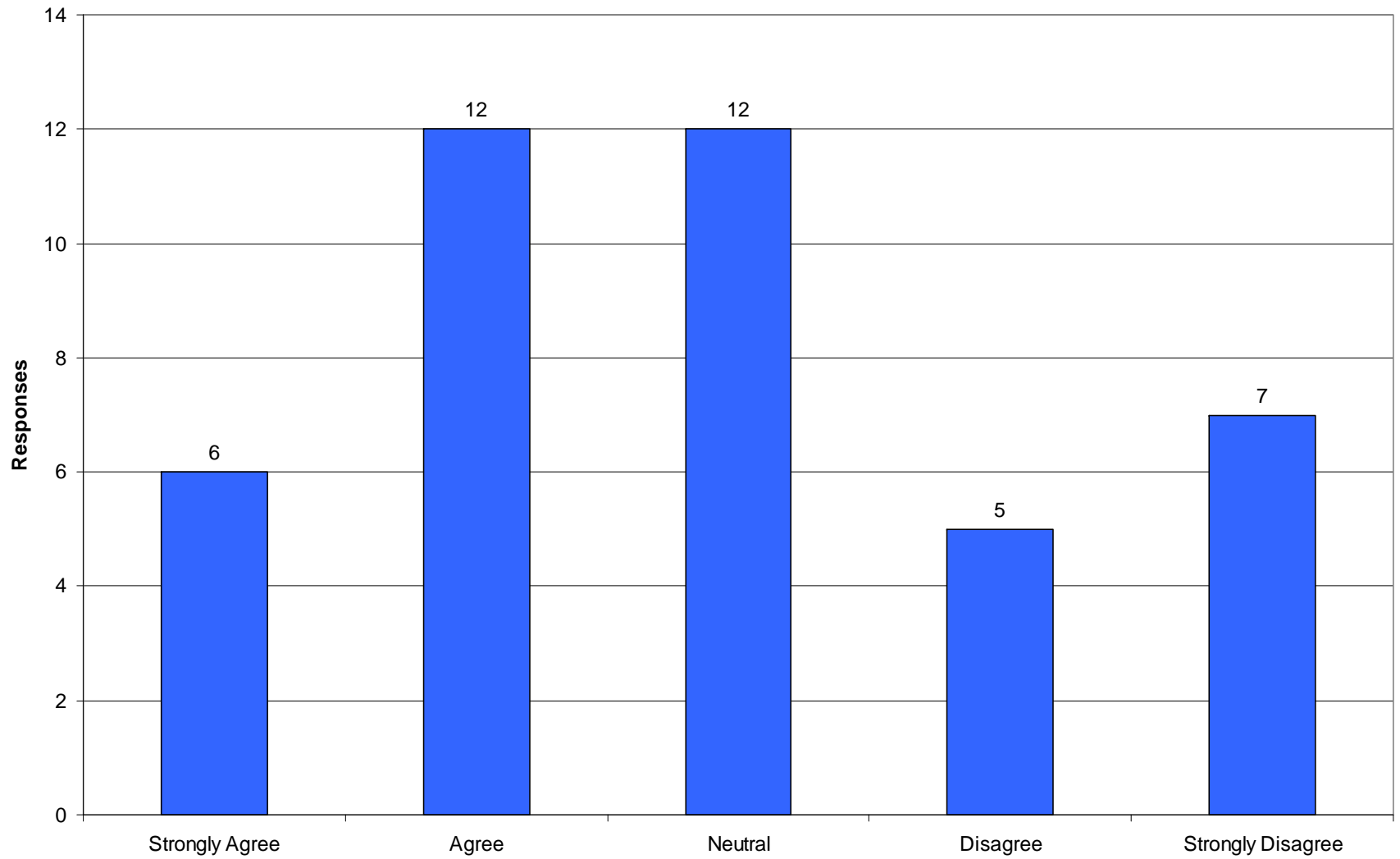
13. The City of Milton and adjacent local governments should work together to ensure that planning priorities are consistent across jurisdictions.



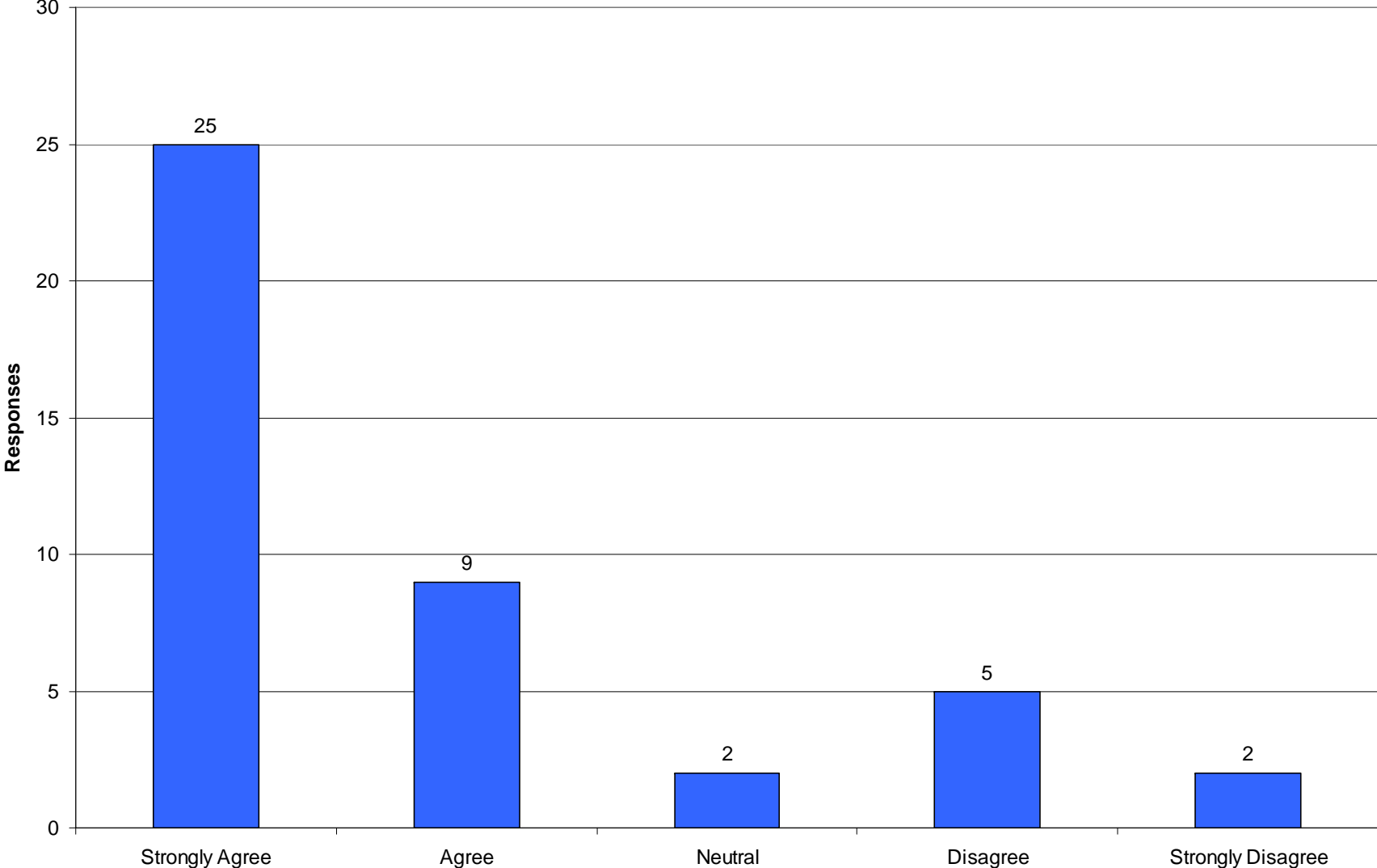
14. Milton needs road improvements in order to improve traffic and mobility problems.



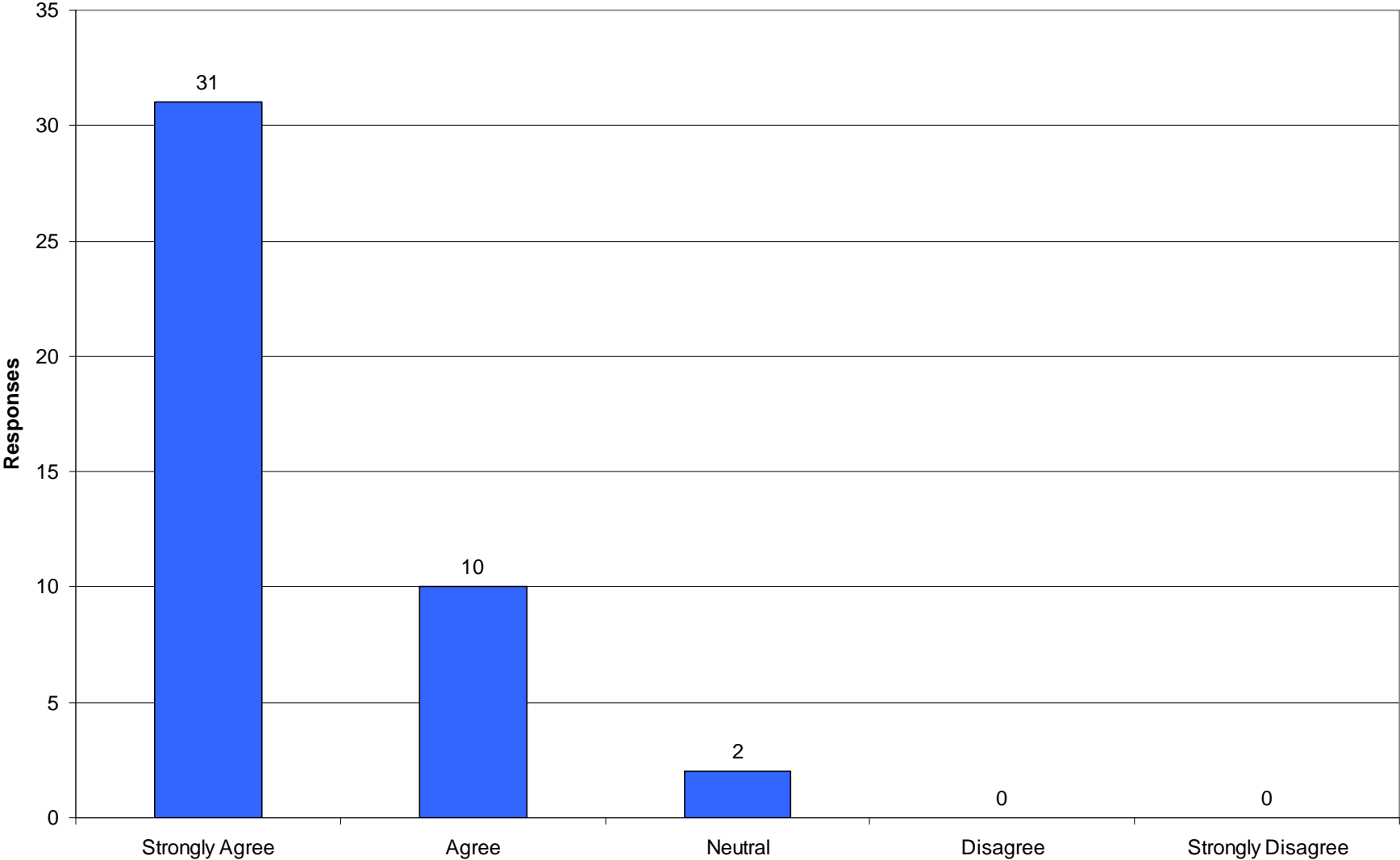

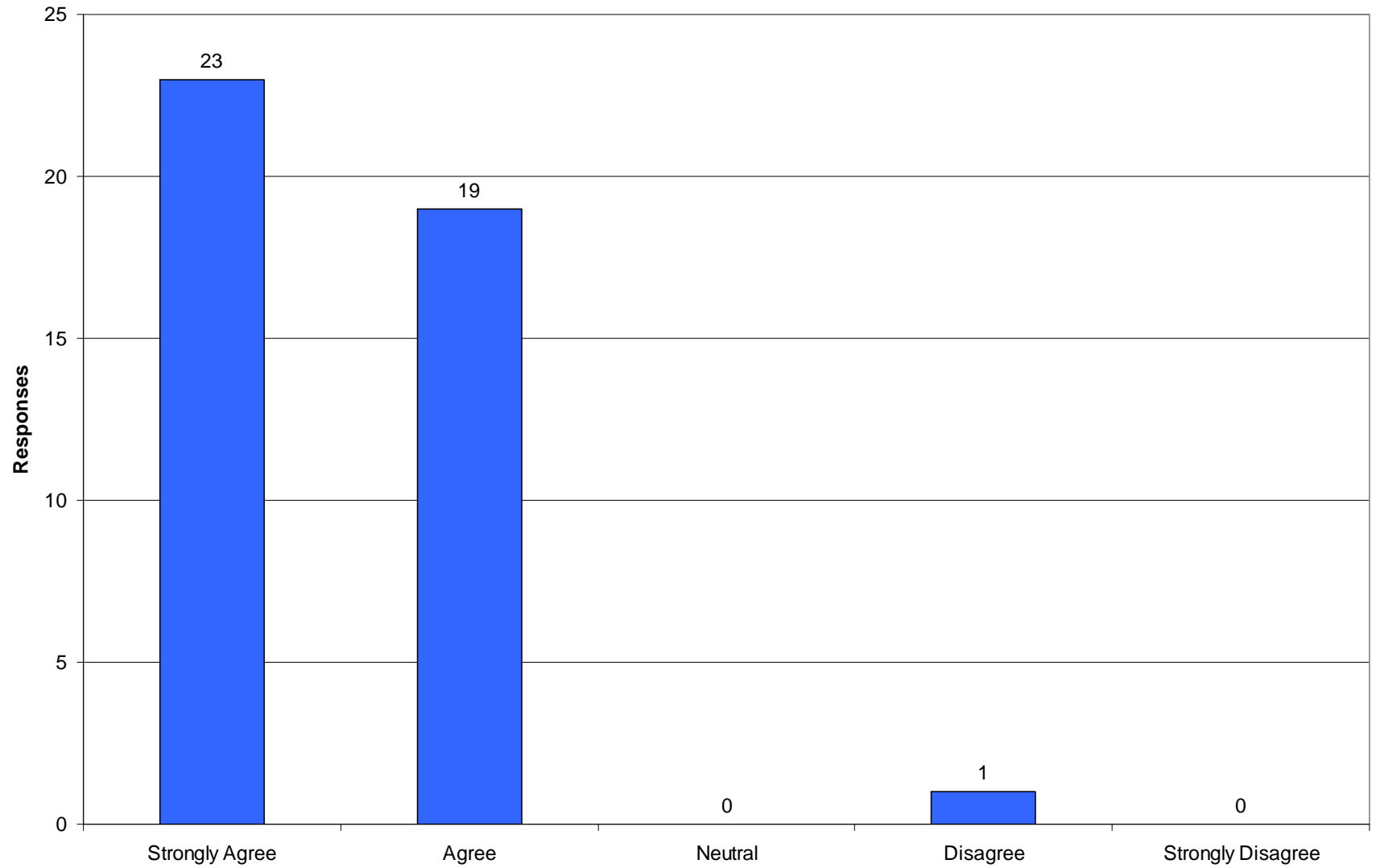
16. The City of Milton should maintain its "no sewer" policy.



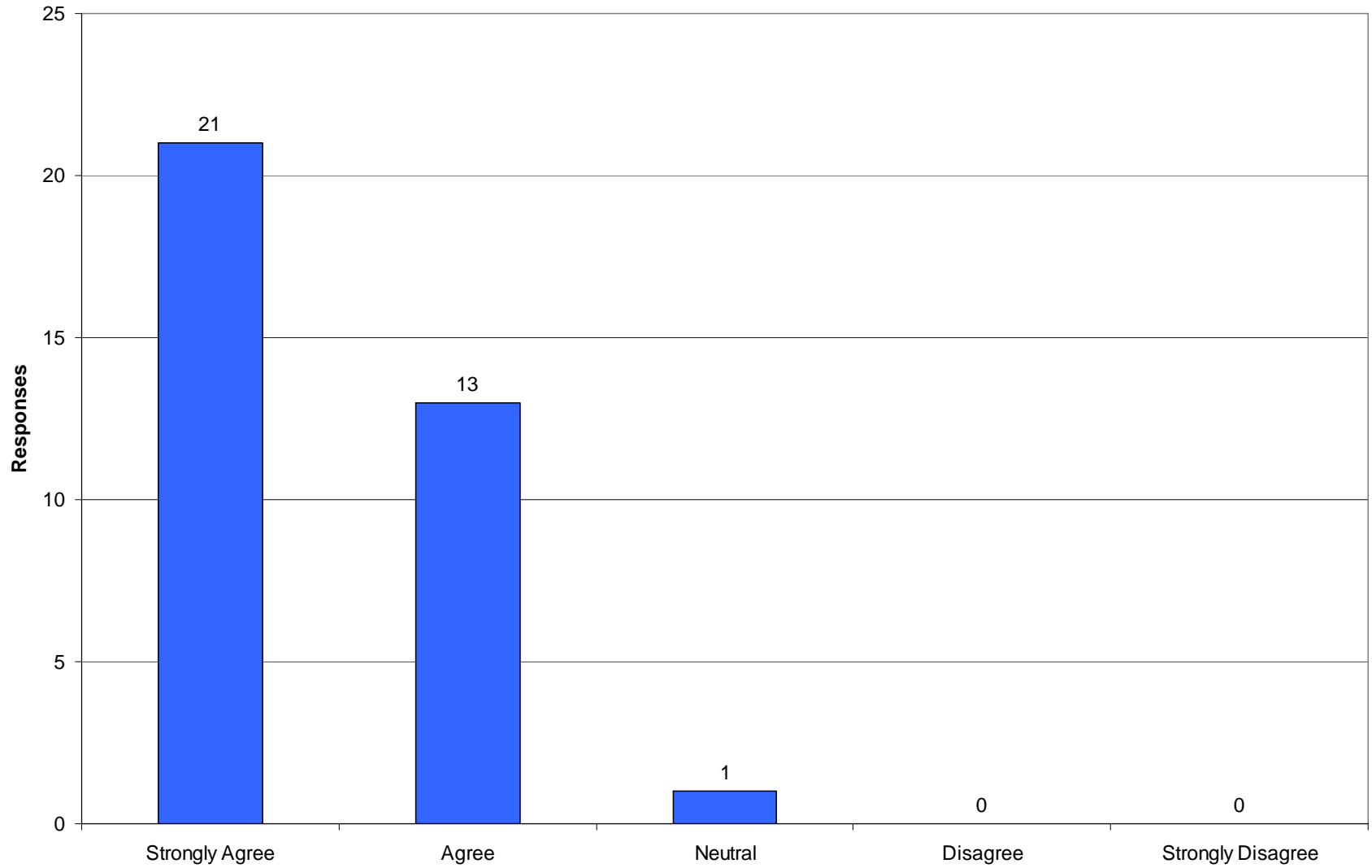
17. The aesthetics and design of commercial corridors should be carefully regulated to promote an attractive community (e.g. sign regulations, strict design guidelines, etc).



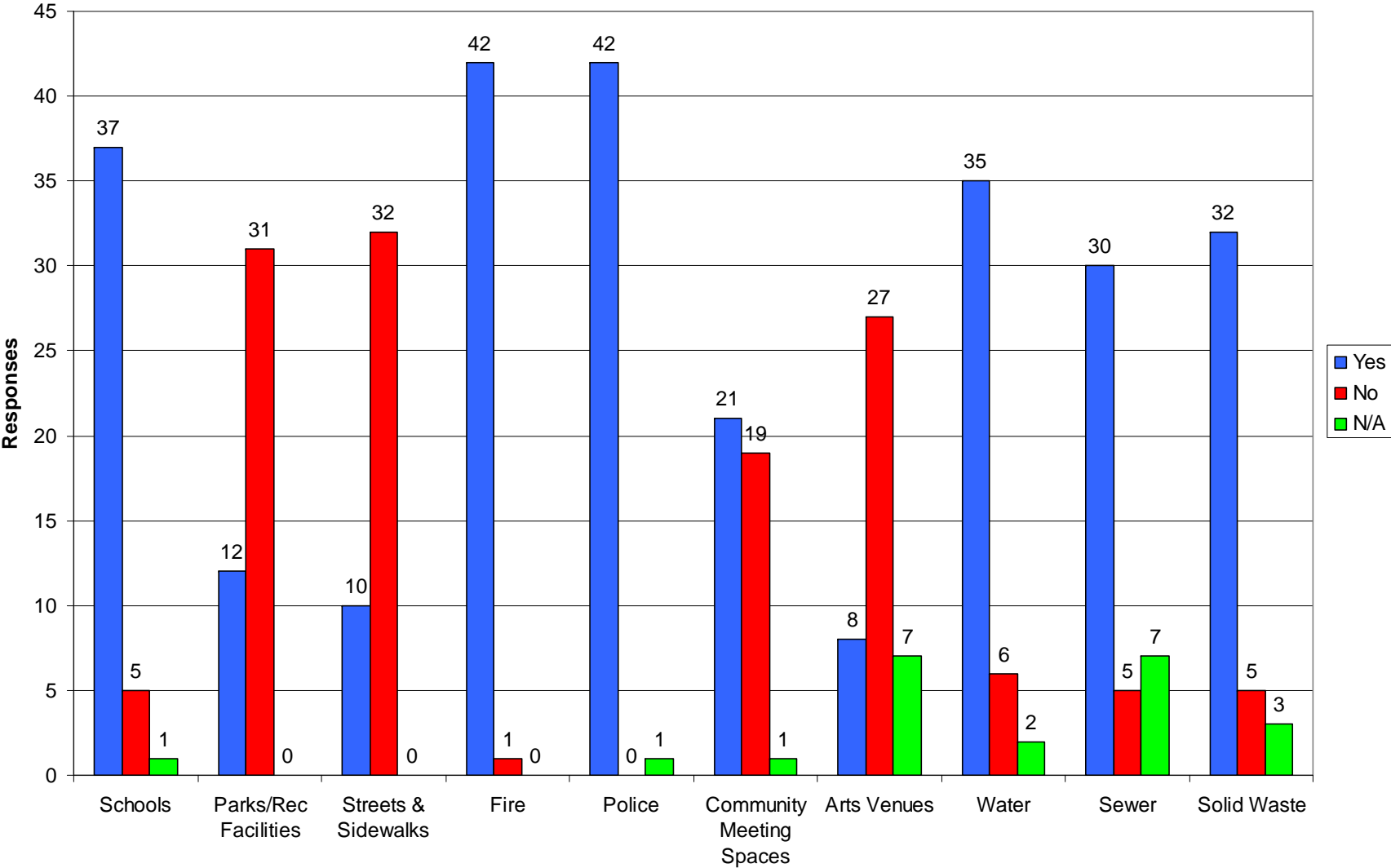
18. The State Route 9 Corridor is essential to the City of Milton as an asset to the economic development of the community.



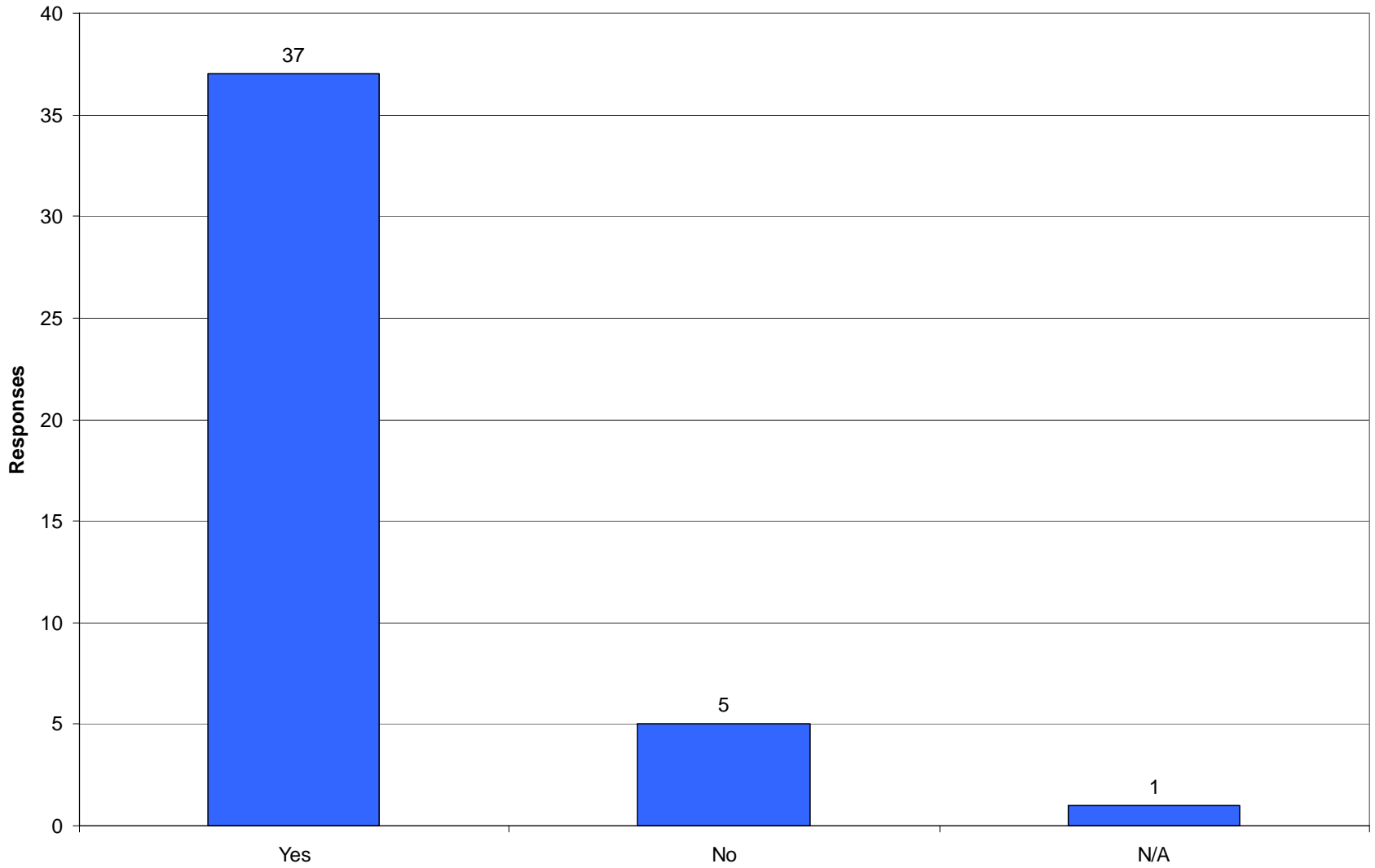
19. It is important that Milton grow in a sustainable way mindful of its impacts both today and in the future as it develops.



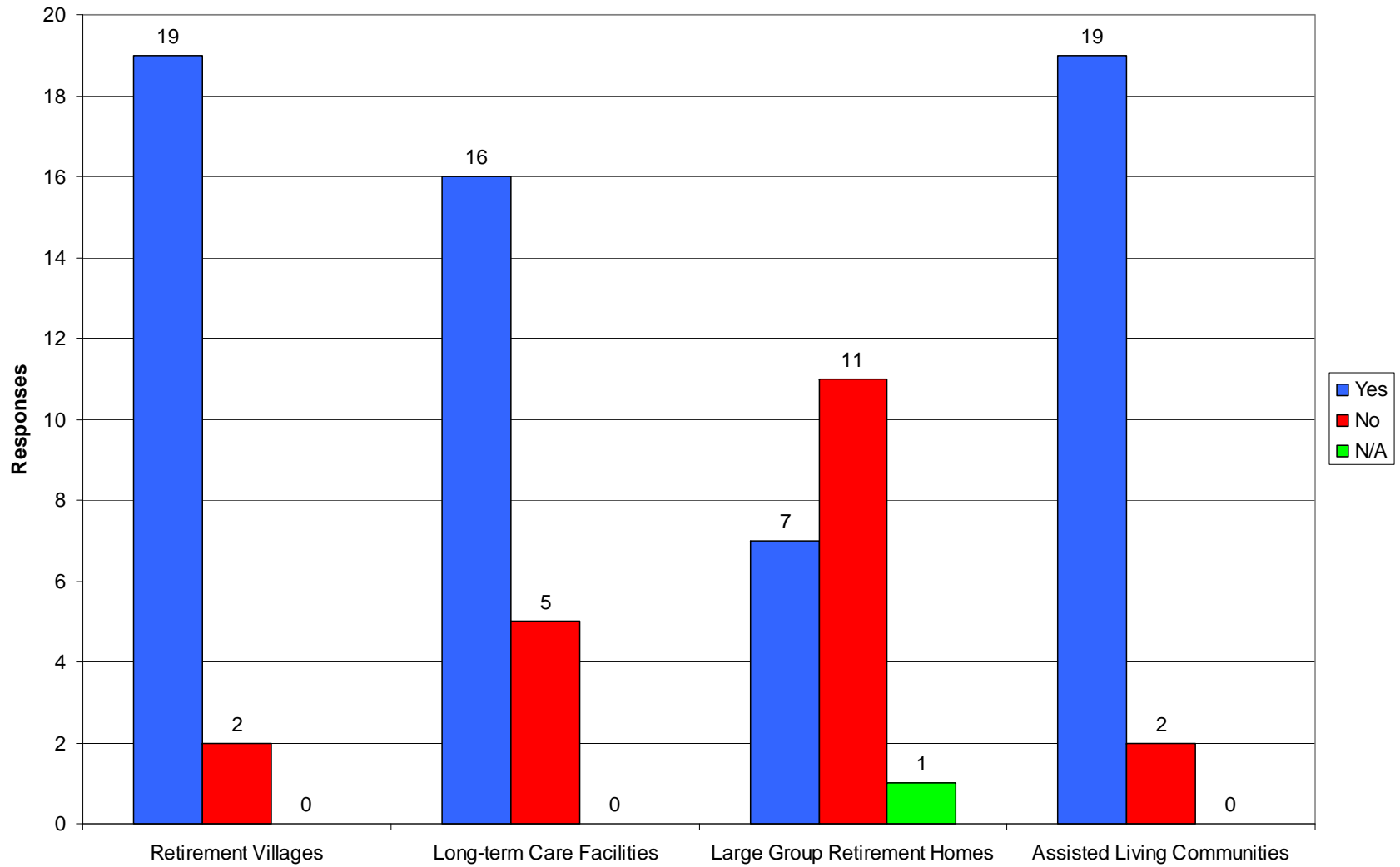
